Thank you to everyone who attended the recent Welcome Meetings. Welcome letters have also been uploaded to our school website under the Class Page. During these sessions, your child's class teacher shared details of this half-term's Home Learning Project.

Please find the project information for each year group below.

Home Learning Project

Throughout the year, children will also be set a **half-termly Home Learning Project** linked to the liturgical year or our Catholic Social Teaching theme. These projects will support our whole-school focus on the **Religious Education curriculum, the Liturgical Year and Catholic Social Teaching**. They will provide opportunities for children and their families to explore their faith, reflect on Gospel values and respond creatively to issues that matter in our world.

Completed projects will be celebrated within the classroom and shared across the school, allowing children to take pride in their work and learn from one another. We look forward to seeing the many different ways children engage with and bring these important aspects of Catholic life to life through their projects.

Our first Home Learning Project is based on the Season of Creation, celebrating the Year of St Francis of Assisi, and is due in school by **Friday 2nd October**.

Nursery:

Children in Nursery are asked to complete this challenge at home

What part of God's creation do you love most?

Go on a walk and look for signs of God's creation.

You could:

- Collect leaves, sticks or flowers
- Make a nature collage
- Draw animals you spot
- Take photographs

Reception:

Talk with your child about their favourite part of God's creation.

Go on a nature walk together and look for signs of God's creation.



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Year 1 and Year 2:

Children in Year 1 and 2 are asked to decorate a flower to show the beauty of God's creation. The template will be sent home.

Year 3 and Year 4:

Children are asked to choose three ways that they and their family can care for God's creation for one week. They should record their three promises on a small pledge, which will be brought into school and displayed in our classroom.

Year 5 and 6:

Children in UKS2 will research an environmental issue of their choice, such as plastic pollution, deforestation, climate change, or endangered species. They will present their findings in either a poster or an information booklet. The project should explain the environmental issue, outline why it is important, and consider how Christians can take positive action to help care for God's creation.
