

## St Dunstan's Outcomes: 2019

The national results outlined below are provisional and will be until November 2019.

**Disadvantaged children:** this is a term used by the government for children who are, or have ever been, on Free School Meals. Extra money is given to the school to help these children, who in the past have under achieved, to ensure that they achieve at least the expected standard.

There is an expected standard that children are expected to reach for Reception and Year 1 Phonics.

In Years 2 and 6 there is also Greater Depth (GD). The children who reach GD are operating above the standard expected for their age.

### Progress scores (Page 5)

These are the scores that children are given for their progress between Year 2 and Year 6.

An average child at an average English school would score 0.0.
